Women in Technology Award

Encouraging women to pursue education, career opportunities and leadership roles in technology

The world economy, industry and sciences are becoming increasingly digitized, and these developments are disrupting society and familiar social processes. Women, however, are still largely underrepresented in technology fields. To create a world in which men and women have equal opportunities, women need to have an active role in technology and technological developments. Zonta International is pleased to offer its new Zonta International Women in Technology Scholarship to encourage women to pursue education, career opportunities and leadership roles in technology.

Eligibility

Women pursuing a technology degree or closely related program, who demonstrate outstanding potential in the field, are eligible to apply.

Women not enrolled in a university are also eligible as long as they submit:

- Evidence of completed trainings and outstanding performance.
- Description of current job with information about path that led to that job.
- Employer confirmation and recommendation or client testimonial supported by evidence.
- Reason for applying and description of desired career.
- Evidence of educational project plan (e.g. proof of course opportunities).

Golden Z club members may apply.

Classified members (club members and individuals with direct membership with Zonta International) and employees of Zonta International and Zonta International Foundation, and their family members (ancestors, descendants, adoptees, siblings, nieces or cousins, and those of their spouse or co-habiting partner), are not eligible to apply.

Birthing Kit Report - March

Who would have thought that in 2019:

- we would have distributed over 2 million kits to women in remote regions of over 30 countries. At least 1 million made by Zonta, resulting in tens of thousands of women and double that number of babies being alive today
- we would have trained over 12,000 Traditional Birth Attendants. Education is everything
- a 4-year accredited nursing school would evolve in DRC from a BKF funded train the trainer program and that last year 10 nurses would graduate. All have gone back to their remote communities.

The BKF has now expanded into literacy education programs at high schools in Uganda to impact on attitudes to child marriage, which ties in with Zonta's child marriage platform.

What is the vision for the future of the Birthing Kit Foundation?

The BKFA has just completed it Adaptive Strategy for 2019 – 2021. It is on our website.

Our goal is to reach 1.5 million people around the world in the next 3 years

How will we achieve this?

- 1. By being a key partner in 3 large scale global collaborations.
- 2. By being a recommended partner of Australian individuals
- 3. By being a recommended partner across business, social and government spheres.
- 4. By growing in size, capacity and revenue
- 5. By innovating new solutions and our business model in response to global need.
- 6. By being a recognised social innovation and human-centred design organisation.

The challenge: Around 300,000 women and over 3 million newborns die each year at the time of birth. This is preventable, and this is why we exist.

Our Adaptive Strategy is a document of vision and will take us into the future as a leader in women's care at childbirth worldwide.

We have made the decision after discussions with our field partners to make two changes to our essential birthing kit

To improve the quality of our kits as well as the experience of the women who
use them by supplying a piece of standardised and professionally sourced soap
to our kit (individually wrapped). This change will also improve the ease and
experience of those who assemble our birthing kits.

2. To improve the sustainability of providing, delivering, assessing and supporting our birthing kits by increasing the price of each kit to \$5.

This will be our first price increase in seven years. During those years we have not been immune to the pressure of continuously rising costs meaning that an increase in price is inevitable and necessary.

We wanted to communicate with all of you as early as possible and with full transparency, as these changes will come into effect for all kits assembled from 1 July 2019. If you have already made a booking after this date, the \$3 price will be honoured.

No one receiving or making our kits will dispute the value of these kits at \$5.

We plan to make over 200,000 kits per year to distribute. There is still a huge demand.

So, the challenge to all our kit makers is to maintain or grow their kit making capacity.

We understand clubs will need assistance to do this and we will work on strategies to help our kit makers be more innovative in raising funds while improving their PR exposure.

I am immensely proud of where we started, our journey, and I am excited about where we are going into the future.

Who would have thought that at our Zonta 100 conference in September, it will coincidentally be exactly 20 years since the first kits were made! Serendipity.

Area 1

Botany Bay



The Zonta Club of Botany Bay continues to flourish and move rapidly forward, with many of our projects and programs ramping up as the year unfolds. Early February saw a very successful packing day for Kookaburra Kids, where members assembled toiletry bags for the young people who attend their camps. 250 bags were packed – a mammoth effort.

In that same week, our social arm had a lovely outing, with a ferry trip to Bundeena followed by a leisurely lunch at the Bundeena RSL, proving a time of fun, fellowship and laughter.

Later in February, member Ann Selle, who designed the Breast Care Cushions Zonta distributes, flew to Sri Lanka. She took with her a breast care nurse and a physician and together, and with the help of the Zonta Club of Columbo, ran an Australian Breast Cancer Nursing Workshop for originally 38 Sri Lankan nurses. As it turned out, the initiative was so well received that 48 nurses attended, plus 4 doctors and many Ministry of Health employees. Following the workshop, the head of the National Cancer Council of the Ministry of Health put forward several recommendations including the establishment of Breast Care centres, nurse empowerment and the development of client literature to name but a few. Watch this space!

Mid-March was to be our Annual Golf Day at Calderwood Gold Course, but the weather gods had other plans – we have had to reschedule to July 25th. With the Area 1 Workshop, more social outings, Bunnings BBQ's and out Antiques and Collectibles Fair on June 30th, this first six months look to be busy and productive just the way our Club likes it.!



Central Coast

There was certainly a happy buzz at our recent Birthing Kit Assembly Day. Two hundred and thirty enthusiastic volunteers and Zonta members worked together to pack an amazing 5000 birthing kits for mothers and babies in Western New Guinea, Uganda, DR Congo and Nigeria. Central Coast Grammar School generously hosted our packing day on 9th March, and a number of willing students and staff also contributed their time and energy to this worthwhile project. This was an inspiring community event bringing the local population together for a united purpose.



For the past five years Zonta Central Coast has had a pivotal role on the local



International Women's Day Committee. Working in partnership with Soroptimists, CWA, Women's Health, BPW and University of Newcastle, The Festival of Women published a calendar of 16 local women's events. On 2nd March ZCC facilitated a Women's Expo at Erina Fair, showcasing 20 local women's services and providing entertainment for the local community. The expo was a fun and informative day, supporting health and wellbeing for the many women,

girls and extended families attending the event.

Each year ZCC has the great pleasure of awarding study grants to young women sitting for the Higher School Certificate. Local high schools nominate possible recipients and following an interview process the successful students attend a ZCC dinner meeting to be congratulated for their efforts. In 2019 six students are being assisted with their educational expenses and have the option of participating in mentoring if they wish. These young women are inspiring, and we wish them every success in the future.

At the Northern Beaches Council, Volunteers Award Night, ZCNB was awarded a Certificate of Appreciation for their work at the Australia Day Breakfast. Evelyn Whittaker accepted the award on the club's behalf.

This was followed by the annual Pittwater International Women's Day Breakfast held at the Royal Prince Alfred Yacht Club on 6 March 2019, a sold-out event with 210 attendees. At this event the Hon Rob Stokes announces "the Pittwater Woman of the Year, and this year the Zonta Club of Northern Beaches was announced as the winner of the award. The look of surprise and amazement on the faces of club members was so special. Club President Bernardine Guy accepted the award on behalf of the club and members were each presented with a yellow rose.

"The work they do to fund, prepare and dispatch birthing kits to women in developing countries is not only inspiring – it's also a powerful way of connecting communities at opposite sides of the world. "This award is a great way to acknowledge their inspirational efforts and the positive messages they spread throughout our community," Rob Stokes said.

Sydney Hills

The 26th Western Sydney IWD Breakfast (one of our club's projects) was held on 8 March 2019 at the Novotel Sydney Parramatta. A delightful addition to this year's event was the presentation of the Zonta International Young Women in Public Affairs (YWPA) Award. The YWPA Award has been in existence worldwide for over 25 years but 2019 was the first time that Zonta Sydney Hills had offered the award to local schools since early in 2000.

In Mid October 2018 the principals of forty-eight schools in Western Sydney and the Hills District were individually contacted by email asking their school to publicise the award and encourage senior female students to apply. Following the lengthy process of a second mail-out and phone contact with the schools, our Club's YWPA Committee was pleased to receive four applications that were considered to be of a high standard from James Ruse Agricultural High School (3 applications) and Cerdon College (1 application).

The panel (Donna Fraser, Shirley Purser and Kaye Amies) decided that these four candidates deserved to be finalists with one candidate, Aneesa Abdu from JRAHS, being selected as the winner. All four candidates were sent correspondence advising them that they were award finalists and outlining arrangements to assist them to attend the WSIWD Breakfast as our club's honoured guests, including the requirement to deliver a short 3-minute address should they be announced as the winner. They all attended the event together with a parent and a school representative.

Finalists received certificates and a \$50 book voucher whilst the winner received a cheque for \$500 and the winner's certificate. The opportunity to introduce the four finalists and announce the winner at the IWD event enabled all those involved in the Award to enjoy the event even more than usual! Several students attending the breakfast asked for further information about the award, so our club is expecting an increased interest in the next YWPA round that is due to commence mid-year. This time, though, we will be sending out the information to schools as soon as possible after it appears on the ZI Website so we can get the responses happening a lot earlier. Aneesa's successful application from our club's YWPA Award will be submitted to the Zonta District Awards (NSW and ACT) by the due date (1st April) and we will look forward to hearing how everything goes with that round of awards.



Sydney West

The Zonta Club of Sydney West's 18th International Women's Day breakfast on March 8th was a feast of awards and speakers: Year 10 Girls' Citizenship Awards, Young Men Standing Strong against Domestic Violence Awards, Young Women in Public Affairs Awards, a District J M Klausman Award winner, and an inspiring speech by Lee de Winton, CEO of Sydney Metro Airports.

Held in the stunning Ballroom at Bankstown Sports, more than 250 people, mainly senior students from the 18 public high schools with whom Zonta Sydney West has a partnership, were impressed by girls as young as 17 speaking eloquently about gender equality and other women's issues which are important in today's world.

The presence of eleven young men from boys' and coed schools, chosen by their schools for their stance against domestic violence, embodies Zonta Sydney West's vision of an emerging solution to domestic violence through collaboration not enmity.

Helaina Narvaiza, winner of the District 24 JM Klausman Award, spoke of her study opportunities at London School of Economics. District Governor, Sharyl Scott presented Helaina with her Award.

Lee de Winton spoke eloquently of her life story, including her service as a Wing Commander in the Royal Australian Air Force. Her conversational delivery won many admirers, and her call to the young people to be aspirational was compelling and well received.

For some years now we have supported the IWD function organized by the Penrith Women's Health Centre and supported by Penrith City Council.
