Dear Fellow Zontians.

This month Zonta International President Dr Susanne von Bassewitz has met a panel of experts at the UN headquarters in Vienna, Austria to discuss forced and early marriage. It was the platform to introduce the UNFPA-UNICEF Global Programme to Accelerate Action to End Child Marriage. This program is present in 12 countries: Bangladesh, Burkina Faso, Ethiopia, Ghana, India, Mozambique, Nepal, Niger, Sierra Leone, Uganda, Yemen and Zambia and is made possible with the support of Zonta International, the first private sector donor to the Programme. In Australia, New South Wales and Victoria have the most reports of this violation of human rights. Clubs are encouraged to discuss and be informed about the state laws in this area.

During the September conference we will have the privilege of listening to Dr Susanne von Bassewitz and speakers from Good Shepard Australia New Zealand and Queensland University discussing Forced Marriage with an Australia New Zealand perspective.

Growing up in New Plymouth, New Zealand has some special memories, such as beautiful Pukekura Park in view of spectacular Mount Taranaki. Equally, having spent most of my adult years in Sydney I have the absolute pleasure of attending performances in the Sydney Opera House; one of favourite past-times. Memories are very special to all of us as we remember the people we were with and the activities we participated in. I invite you to come and share the special memory for the Zonta 100 conference in Brisbane. Four newsletters have been sent out to all members and interested parties so far. However, if you are missing out the special items of news, please update your details on the Zonta International member login, which the district uses to make contact with you.





I have been out and about this month with a very special ceremony of induction of the Strathfield Girls Z Club who are intending to venture north and come as a group to the conference. Any other Z Club members are strongly urged to join the group as we welcome the youth members to the conference, sharing their views and experiencing the wider Zonta world. I travelled to Melbourne for the e-Security for Women Alliance annual meeting where the project of surveying the Caring Economy was discussed; the role of carers, many of whom are women in early childhood, disability and aged care to name a few.

I attended the Zonta club of Melbourne on Yarra dinner meeting where I met fellow District 23 Governor Jane Adornetto and members of the club. Last week, I joined past-Governor Dr Janette Curtis at the 2-day meeting of the Equality Rights Alliance where the group planned for continuing advocacy on the major policies affecting women in Australia concerning gender equality, women's leadership and women's diversity.

Lastly, I remind clubs to send in your club nominations of the Centenary Award to Chair Amanda Gibson so we can recognise those fabulous women in your communities.

Service Chair Report

My role as D24 Service Chair so far has been coordinating Breast Care Cushions requests and the ZI D24 Women of Achievement Award applications.

There are many Service Projects that our clubs are involved in such as Kookaburra Kids, Birthing Kits, Days for Girls, drought relief in rural areas and support for Refuges. I would like to highlight in my next report the service projects that your club has been participating in to empower women so please contact me so I can put them in the next Voice report.

In regard to Breast Care Cushions, I have on average 5 enquires per month and I post approximately 3 cushions each month. My stockpile of cushions which ran very low recently was topped up thanks to Zonta Club of Botany Bay. Thanks also to Zonta Club of Macarthur for supplying cushions and I'm looking forward to other clubs in D24 contributing if they can.

The requests for breast cushions come from women nationwide and overseas. Some requests are not for them personally but for a friend or relative or in some cases their cushion has been so loved they need a replacement. In many cases I'm able to advise them in regard to cushions being supplied at the hospital they are attending or contact Zonta Clubs interstate or locally that can ensure they receive a cushion.

The majority of the requests come from the information they receive from Breast Care Network, the My Journey Book. Via that contact the requests come to D24 and me. All the women who contact me think they have to purchase the cushion.

I would like to update my spreadsheet regarding the lists of clubs supplying breast cushions to what hospital as there have been some recent changes. Could the contact person for each club please let me know what hospital your club is supplying cushions to and also how many cushions your club supplies each year.

Looking forward to hearing from you and seeing some of you at the Brisbane Conference.

The photo I have included in my report is a cushion stuffing day at Club Central Menai earlier this year. ZCBB is fortunate to get Club grants that help fund our Breast Cushions.

The Zonta Club of Nepean Valley has been assembling birthing kits every year since 2004. This year was no exception. On Sunday 19 May another 1,000 kits at a cost of \$3,000 was added to our tally, taking our overall contribution over 16 years to 17,200 kits at a total cost of \$32,400.
