#### Dear Fellow Zontians,

Winter is upon us and as I watch my social media feed, I can see many of my Zonta friends in much warmer places. It IS time to travel and I hope many of you are getting excited about travelling to Brisbane and the 6-8 September conference.

All Club Presidents have now been sent the Call to Conference and in the coming month you will be discussing the conference business. Please continue to send in the delegate forms and read the Conference newsletter to keep up with arrangements. With only seven weeks to go until the conference, I have been meeting with the D24 Conference Chair for the business session Barbara Horsfield and District Secretary Brenda Bradbery to finalise the program. Please look out for an email with the business papers for the conference in the new three weeks. This will include the full conference program and the District Guidelines. It has been very rewarding to watch the number of registrations climb past 700 with the estimated number being closer to 800. If you are a delegate credential desk will be open from 7.30 on Friday 6<sup>th</sup> September. Due to restrictions in using the Convention Centre the Registration Desk will not be open until the <u>Friday morning</u>. Delegates please allow time to go to registrations to be seated in the business sessions by 8.45 am.

I have the pleasure of announcing the finalists for 'Share Your Story', a short presentation about a service or advocacy project completed by a club in District 24. Botany Bay project of Breast Care Training gained the award for service and The Northern Beaches club was the finalist for advocating for the empowerment of women. Their presentations will be seen during the conference. Thank you to the other clubs who presented their different projects for the Share Your Story presentations at conference. You truly make a difference to your communities.

This month I will have the delightful experience of sitting with the committee for the Centennary Anniversary Award. I wish to thank Amanda Gibson who chaired the committee of Fran Lyndon-Ross (Area 1), Leanne Elliott (Area 2), and Jenny Wiseman (Area 3), in the process of selection. It was a tough call with 17 very commendable applicants. The finalist has been selected and will be with us for the presentation at the conference. All applicants will be acknowledged at the business session of the conference to honour their achievements.

In the next few weeks I will celebrate the Zonta Club of Sydney Hills 40<sup>th</sup> birthday with a large group of party loving people and travel to the Central Coast for their 32<sup>nd</sup> annual women in service dinner which involves many service clubs of the Central Coast but hosted this year by Zonta International. I congratulate both clubs for the impact they have on their wider communities and will continue to do so as we **Honour and Empower.** 

I hope many of you have been reading the many quotes and news items on the Zonta International social media sites. Research conducted in the U.S comparing many other large service organisations have put Zonta International streets ahead in utilising Twitter, Facebook, Instagram and e-newsletters to connect and communicate with members and the wider society. Last week I had the absolute delight of seeing my own club Macarthur have an article on Twitter, as did the Zonta Club of Armidale. Congratulations to both clubs.

Zonta International have announced the allocation of the grant and it is a delight to announce that the Zonta clubs of Orange, Cumberland West and Macarthur have been successful. I know there were many others in District 24 submitted and some of you will be very disappointed about not gaining a grant.

There are 289 submissions, 61% being submitted in the last week and only 62 clubs globally were awarded a grant in support of their partnering organisations. Projects were awarded on merit by a panel of independent judges not by district, so there are some district not receiving an award. If you have any question about the allocation of the grants please contact Governor Sharyl Scott, who will be able to explain the process to you. Zonta International has written a Q&A for clubs with questions about the grants, which has been sent to me.

Cumberland West - \$4,884 with Parramatta Mission - Supply of equipment for mothers and their babies who are at risk offer experiencing homelessness

Macarthur - \$4,856 with Baptist Care Housing and Retirement Living Campbelltown Macarthur - Making change by Education - Development of a training package

Orange - \$4,925 with Housing Plus - Zonta Wellness Retreat

We raised \$4000 for our worthy causes; breast cushions and birthing kits, services which assist keeping women out of prison, our awards and scholarships, and donations to Lou's Place in Kings Cross.

During our May meeting we were fortunate to have Professor Jennifer Burn as our guest speaker. Jennifer is the Interim Anti-slavery Commissioner of NSW, and she outlined the Modern Slavery Act, and gave interesting examples such as forced marriages, which affect women in Australia, and of the consequences once the act comes into effect. Members had a multitude of questions after her presentation, and we discussed support networks for those affected by modern slavery.

At our AGM, out-going President Kerrie Bigsworth, outlined the successes of our year at Sydney Zonta, and welcomed Joanna Quinn as new President, assisted by Vanessa Cook as Vice-President.

# Sydney



June saw members and helpers pack 600 kits for the Birthing Kit Foundation of Australia. Thanks to employees of Optiver who helped as part of their 'Corporate Social Responsibility' initiative.

Zonta Club of Sydney sponsored a section in Sydney Eisteddfod in honour of Elizabeth Todd, a charter member of the ZCS, who was the first woman to be appointed as a lecturer (singing) at the Sydney Conservatorium, and became Senior Lecturer and Head of Vocal Studies. She received many honours and awards relating to her pioneering contributions in music. The inaugural competition (for Female Voices Solo 16-20years) was held in June, and the winner Belinda Thomas, received The Elizabeth Todd OAM Memorial

Award from club president Joanna Quinn. Elizabeth was a member of Sydney Zonta Club for 51 years, a club president and a past Governor of District 16, which at that time (1978-80) encompassed Australia and New Zealand. She passed away in 2017.

In June, our MBA Award recipient Vanessa Sore, addressed the club, and we welcomed her as a member in July. We also thanked long-standing members for service: Susan Copeland (15yrs), Marilyn Smith (10yrs) and Marcia Dane, (50yrs).

Our guest speaker, Nicole Yade, manager of Lou's Place, Potts Point, outlined how the support of ZCS and other donors, has allowed Lou's to extend and improve services to disadvantaged and homeless women of Sydney. Lou's is proudly celebrating 20 years as Sydney's only daytime refuge which assists with crisis intervention, housing, legal issues, counselling, addiction and mental health.

As part of this mission, the Zonta Club of Berry will be holding a birthing kit assembly day on the 17<sup>th</sup> August 2019. This is usually a very well supported event with community members returning year after year to assist on the day.

Our club also held a small event to mark our friendship in Zonta, with members and partners joining together for a mediterranean themed dinner. It's a lovely thing to grow our friendships within the club while we provide support and assistance to the wider community.

Planning has commenced for our Annual Trivia night and our Centenary Working group is progressing a range of ideas to mark this milestone. Our club enjoyed finding out more from one of our local artists about her plans to complete a Master of fine arts at the London Architecture School, and how art can be a very effective vehicle for advocacy and social justice.

Our community links continue with practical support provided to women experiencing hardship due to domestic violence, and continued support has been provided to the Shoalhaven Education Fund to advance educational opportunities for young people in our community.

### Canberra

#### BUNNINGS BBQ - Sunday 7th July

We were assisted by St Vincent de Pauls' Street to Home personnel and some of the funds raised will go to supply their night bus with warm tracksuits for women who are living on the streets.

#### TRIVIA NIGHT - Friday 26th July

We are excited to be holding our 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Trivia night in aid of Femili PNG. Femili PNG is a local NGO (run out of the Crawford School at the ANU) but working in Lae & Port Moresby running Case Management Centres to assist survivors of family and sexual violence.



### **Cumberland West**

Our club was delighted with the news that we were awarded with one of the Centennial Award Grants.

This grant is for partnering with Parramatta Mission to purchase and provide baby equipment for their facility to house young mothers/mothers to be in a building near Parramatta. The young women must be under 25 for this facility and many of them have been homeless and unable to access support from their families. The facility supports them during the birth of their child and assists with finding them somewhere to live afterwards.

Parramatta Mission will purchase baby equipment, eg cots, strollers, highchairs, baby baths and then 'lend' them to the young mothers for as long as needed. Then the equipment will come back to the facility to be used by another young mother. Our role will be to monitor the funds and compile reports for Zonta International as required. We will have stickers made for the equipment with the Zonta logo as well as a few words on them.

We have worked with Parramatta Mission before on several projects and have found them to be a very good, professional organisation. We worked with them on the grant application.


#### **Trivia Night**
